Shapiro Peer Education Center Opens

Eagleville Hospital hosted a ribbon-cutting ceremony to celebrate the opening of the Shapiro Peer Education Center, a new dedicated space located within the Shapiro Family Wellness Wing of the Center for Therapy and Wellness.

The Shapiro Peer Education Center was designed to support patient recovery through peer-led education and support programs that enhance well-being during inpatient treatment and extend into post-discharge recovery. The center provides a welcoming, purpose-built environment where patients can connect, learn, and gain practical tools from individuals with lived experience.

The new center honors the Shapiro family's long-standing commitment to Eagleville Hospital and its mission. Marion Shapiro, Psy.D., served as a dedicated member of the Eagleville Hospital Board for many years, helping to guide the organization's work and vision. More than 20 years ago, the Shapiro family established an educational fund to support patient learning and recovery, and they, along with their friends and extended family, have remained steadfast supporters ever since.

Eagleville Hospital previously operated a peer education center, which closed during the COVID-19 pandemic. Through the Shapiro family's generous gifts

and continued partnership, the hospital is now able to reestablish and reimagine this vital resource for patients and their long-term recovery.

"This center represents both a fresh start and a powerful continuation of the Shapiro family's legacy," said Jessie Robinson, Chief Development Officer. "Peer education plays a critical role in recovery, and this space will allow us to strengthen connection, hope, and healing for patients during treatment and beyond."



Eagleville Named to *Newsweek* Best Addiction Treatment Centers List

Eagleville Hospital was recently named to Newsweek magazine's list of America's Best Addiction Treatment Centers. The survey evaluated facilities in the 25 states with the highest number of addiction treatment centers. The remaining states were then grouped into four regions and facilities from these states were grouped accordingly. The list of the best centers was developed from four data sources, including a national online survey from medical professionals working in addiction treatment centers, accreditation and care services data provided by SAMHSA and Google

reviews. Using this information, a quality score was calculated for each recommended facility.

We're proud of this distinction. Eagleville Hospital has been helping patients in need in the metro Philadelphia area for more than 100 years. This recognition demonstrates the dedication to patient outcomes and provision of exceptional care that is at the heart of Eagleville Hospital.
